General English: Upper Intermediate (GEI2)

Course Length: 55 Lessons Lesson Length: 100 minutes

Course Aims: (adapted from the CEFR 'can do' statements for B2 Level)

By the end of the course students will be able to

- understand extended speech and lectures and follow even complex lines of argument provided the topic is reasonably familiar
- understand most TV news and current affairs programme
- read articles and reports concerned with contemporary problems in which the writers adopt particular stances or viewpoints
- interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible
- take an active part in discussion in familiar contexts, accounting for and sustaining my views
- present clear, detailed descriptions on a wide range of subjects related to my field of interest.
- explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options.
- write letters highlighting the personal significance of events and experiences.
- can write clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects related to my interests, passing on information, giving reasons in support of or against a particular point of view.
